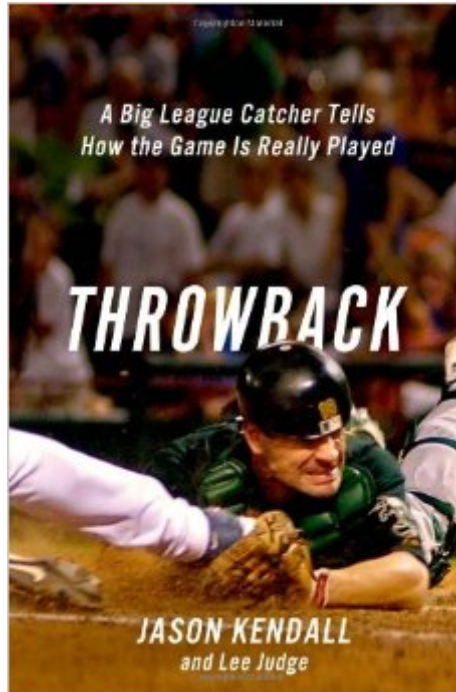

According to Jason Kendall in âœThrowback,â • the sport of baseball is non-stop action. There are always adjustments underway based on the pitcher, the count, the hitter, the time of day.

Everything. âœThrowbackâ • is about the little things that make baseball fascinating. Itâ™s about the minuscule moments of anticipation most of us donâ™t appreciate. If youâ™re someone who

yawns at the thought of baseball, âœ™Throwbackâœ™ isnâœ™t going to change your mind. If you watch even a half-dozen baseball games a year, youâœ™ll get something out of Jason Kendallâœ™s inside look at the infinite number of complexities that go into every moment of âœ™action.âœ™ The baseball may not be âœ™in play,âœ™ but the game is being âœ™playedâœ™ by players, coaches and managers anticipating the next moment. Every pitch, every defensive position, every slide, every injustice meted out earlier in the game (or earlier in the seasonâœ™ or the season before that). The writing is breezy. And easy. It is a bit repetitive in spots. A catcher, Kendall played with a blunt and hard-nosed style. His prose is a good match for his approach to the sport. He wonâœ™t be confused with John Updike or Roger Angell. However, he is self-effacing and very funny in a few spots. Heâœ™s particularly dismissive of the players who show weakness (as a Colorado Rockies fan, I know what heâœ™s talking about). Writes Kendall: âœ™A guy fouls a ball off his leg and collapses on the ground? Get up; donâœ™t waste my time. If the legâœ™s broke? My badâœ™ sorry I yelled at you. But you see guys hobble around for a while and then announce theyâœ™re okay. If a guy fouls a ball off his leg and makes a big production of itâœ™ if he let us know it hurtâœ™ guess what? Weâœ™re throwing the ball right back in the same spot. Oh, that one hurt?
