

Journalist Danielle Floodâ [™]s brilliant The Unquiet Daughter is a rare example of the best I have seen in memoir writing. There are so many bad ones out there, so many that are very poorly written, even with the assistance of highly-paid ghostwriters. (Yes, ghostwriters for memoirs!) The good, the bad, the ugly of a life are presented thoughtfully in The Unquiet Daughter. Beyond that, this book exists on so many other planes, on many levels. It is a mystery exploring the most profound of mysteries: Who am I? From where, exactly, did I come? It is a tour de force of investigative reporting detailing the last days of the French and Americans in Vietnam during a tragic war. It is also, au fond, a story of what it means to be human, to bounce back from adversity and to have the capacity to forgive those who have been unkind and uncaring. And you will care for the heroine of this memoir, someone who is time after time betrayed and abandoned by those she loves so fiercely and yet bounces back.Danielle Flood thought her stepfather, the American CIA agent Jim Flood, was her biological father; he was not.
